REGULAR MEETING No. 5

REVIEW OF AGENDA:

The Board agreed to accept the agenda as presented.

CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Connie Reagan called the meeting to order at 5:05pm.

BRYAN CRAIG (ICRMP)

Bryan attended the meeting and spoke about the Library's ICRMP policy. Deductible of \$20,000 is waived if insurance is contacted first. Loss of use is not covered by this policy. It should be covered by the building policy paid for by the Library Foundation.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT: SEPTEMBER 2022

Programming

- Banned/Challenged Books Month- I created a little display for banned and challenged books, and it looked like it got a lot of attention (but I didn't take a picture of it- darn). I hope it raised some awareness. I'm grateful that this community doesn't seem inclined to challenge library materials.
- Book Discussion Group- We read challenged books and discussed what elements would have led to people challenging them and trying to have them removed from libraries. As ever, it was a thoughtful, enjoyable discussion. Next

month we will start Let's Talk About It again, and our first book will be The Old Man and the Sea by Ernest Hemingway.

- Story Time- Story time started back up in September. We're seeing smaller numbers because a couple more of our regulars have started Kindergarten. I will keep doing it even if only one kid comes! Which has been the case for baby story time, but that is changing. I had Marshall put an ad in the Weekly Beaver for it, so maybe that will draw a few more in.
- Curiosity Club- Carol is back with 4-H on Wednesday afternoons. The
 Community Church next door started a program for the same age group, at the
 exact same time as our program, but after the first week, it doesn't seem to have
 impacted our numbers very much (the first week I know there were a few kids
 who went over there to see if they would like that program, but they have since
 come back here). I talked to Carol about changing the time, if she wanted to, but
 she felt that she would get kids who wouldn't want to attend a church-related
 activity, and it seems that she was right.
- Teen Program- This program didn't happen in September, because I had inadvertently scheduled it on Homecoming. The teens came in the next week, but since the carpets were being cleaned we didn't have the program. They said they will be back in October, though.

Facility

- Clean Carpets! The Foundation had the carpets cleaned. I don't know if they had
 ever been cleaned before, but they look great! There are a couple of stains that
 they couldn't remove, but everything else looks really good. There was a big spot
 in the meeting room that I thought was just worn out, but it turns out it was just
 super dirty.
- Play Cupboard- Just after Labor Day, I brought in a toy cupboard full of play food and dishes (it was mine and my sisters' and my mom brought it up from Utah). It has been a huge hit! There are a couple of kids who beeline for it as soon as they come in the door, and pretty much anytime there are little kids in here, that's where they can be found. A library seems like a strange place for a play kitchen, but that kind of toy encourages what's called Narrative Play- where kids tell stories through their playing. It's a really good tool for early literacy because of that.
